Greetings from American Legion Post #43 Commander Dan Rasmussen and American Legion Auxiliary Unit #43 President Karen Rasmussen: It has been a busy fall, for example, in September we had our annual Hastings Steak Fry and donated a pickup load of various items with an estimated value of \$3000; plus going to Forest Lake to see how they are preparing for the District Convention in May 2019 (Faribault's turn to host will be May 2020). We, along with the Elks, Marine Corp League and Beyond the Yellow Ribbon also had a send-off for approximately 120 deploying National Guardsmen. October's recap includes the Department Fall Conference in Marshall, our annual membership dinner and having a "paper" drive for Fisher House with an estimated value of \$1000 and presenting them with a \$2000 check. We were also able to tour the Spinal Cord Injury portion of the VA Hospital in Minneapolis which has some state-of-the-art equipment for rehabilitating veterans. It's hard to believe, for instance, that they can map the eye so that the disabled can work a computer with their eyes! The Minnesota Chapter of Paralyzed Veterans was presented a check for \$1000. We have been able to help veterans in these ways due to the success of the Auxiliary Poppy Drive and through the generosity of our members and the community.

We observed the 100th anniversary of the signing of the Armistice with a ceremony at the Veterans Memorial followed by a program and lunch. Details of what happened the morning of November 11, 1918 were read, and a ceremony was held for POW/MIA. Jennie-O Turkey's donation of 130 turkeys for veterans was much appreciated. Gifts were presented to approximately 60-65 veterans in nursing homes and assisted living facilities and Legion and Auxiliary members were also present when some of these facilities and various schools had programs for Veterans Day.

November is National Military Family Appreciation Month and National Education Week is observed. Over 800 apples were delivered to the 16 schools in Faribault. Items have been donated to send to deployed soldiers. Families of those deployed from the National Guards were invited to Wing Night on Giving Tuesday to be presented with Blue Star Banners. It was an honor and a privilege to make them our stars for the night. We were super impressed how far some drove to be our guests. There was a great turnout of families as well as Auxiliary members. Banners are being mailed to those unable to attend as the unit is made up of service members from all over Minnesota, plus Iowa, South Dakota and Wisconsin.

December 3rd is the night of our Christmas Dinner following short meetings of the Legion and Auxiliary. We are asking attendees to bring a new child's book or coloring book and crayons – some quiet activity to help them pass the hours while staying at Fisher House or visiting Hastings Veterans Home. We'll be signing up to visit veterans in their living facility and to deliver some Christmas goodies. There aren't any meetings for the Auxiliary (except for board members on Jan. 23rd) until Feb. 4. Sue Register, Program Director of Hastings Veterans Home, will be addressing the joint membership prior to splitting for our regular Feb. meeting. Another Thrivent Action Team will be working with a \$250 impact card to buy fabric and supplies to make 10-15 large laundry bags, plus dryer sheets and laundry pods as funds allow to present her for the Hastings Home. Other action teams have purchased the blue star banners, items to be mailed to deployed soldiers, and for purchasing Christmas gifts for our local veterans in the nursing homes which makes our funds go further to do more and larger scale projects.

A fund has been established for building improvements by the Legion and SAL.
